



**Memorandum of Agreement
between
Da-Yeh University, Taiwan
and**



Rajamangala University of Technology Rattanakosin, Thailand

Da-Yeh University and Rajamangala University of Technology Rattanakosin have concluded this Memorandum of Agreement in the recognition of the mutual benefits according to their academic communities.

1. The purpose of this Agreement is to promote friendly relations through the development of academic collaboration between the two universities.
2. The collaboration shall be carried out, subject to availability of funds and the approval of each university, through such programmes or activities as:
 - (1) Joint research activities (including exchange of faculty members and research students)
 - (2) Joint teaching or supervision of students
 - (3) Staging of joint seminars, conferences and academic meetings
 - (4) Special academic programmes
 - (5) Education Abroad on the part of undergraduate and postgraduate students, including exchanges, internships, electives and practicum
 - (6) Exchange of academic materials and other information
 - (7) Collaborative academic programmes which may involve cultural activities and a strong field visit component. These may be for groups or for individuals on Independent Guided Study Programmes
 - (8) Joint collaborative Grant Proposals.
3. Faculty members of both universities will be encouraged to consult with each other and to develop specific plans for collaboration in any of the ways mentioned in Article 2 above.
4. Recognizing that the implementation of any form of academic collaboration depends on the availability of financial support, both universities shall use their best endeavours to identify and gain access to suitable sources of funding to support the activities proposed in this Agreement.
5. This Agreement shall be valid for a period of five years and will become effective from the date when signed by each side. Any amendment and/or modification of this Agreement will require written approval of the chief administrative officer of each university and shall be appended hereto. After the initial five year period, this Agreement may be reviewed and renewed by mutual consent every three years.
6. Either party reserves the right to terminate this Agreement upon six months written notice to each other.

**Memorandum of Agreement on Student Exchange
Between
Da-Yeh University, Taiwan
and**



Rajamangala University of Technology Rattanakosin (Thailand)

This document is to stipulate the conditions for enrollments and the administrative matters for student exchange as designated under the Agreement for Academic Cooperation and Exchange between Da-Yeh University and Rajamangala University of Technology Rattanakosin.

1. Number of Students:

The number of students to be exchanged is limited to 6 students from each university per academic year. Each university will seek to achieve a balance in the number of students exchanged each academic year.

2. Selection of Exchange Students:

A home university will nominate students for participation in exchange programs. Students nominated for participation in exchange programs must successfully completed at least one full year of academic study at their home university. The host university shall make the final admission decision in each case.

3. Costs and Exemption:

Exchange student have to pay the tuition fee at their home university and will be exempted from any fee in the host institution, for instance credit fees and student activities fees. Exchange students have to pay their transportation cost, living, allowance, and other personal expense during their study at the host university.

4. Accommodation:

The host institution will assist the exchange students in finding housing in residence halls or alternative accommodation as may be necessary. Students are responsible for the cost of their accommodation.

5. Scholarship:

Each host institution shall endeavor to provide exchange students with scholarship.

6. Health insurance:

Exchange students shall obtain health insurance as required by the respective countries, and shall be responsible for the payment of any expenses which are not covered by their insurance.

7. Visa:

Each host institution shall give exchange students the necessary documents for acquiring a visa, according to the laws and regulations of their respective countries. However, exchange students shall be personally responsible for applying and obtaining the visa.

8. Orientation:

Both institutions shall, in advance, inform exchange students of the contents of this agreement, and each host institution shall organize an orientation for students after their arrival.

9. Counseling:

Each host institution shall appoint advisers for instruction and gives counseling, when necessary.

10. Grading:

Each host institution shall grade exchange students and provide, at no charge, a transcript to the students and their home institution. Both institutions shall recognize the credits attained by exchange students as detailed in the transcript under the established rules of each institution.

11. Expulsion:

Each host institution has the right to expel any student who in the opinion of that institution, does not follow its established rules and/or policies, or does not have a good academic record.

12. Term of Agreement:

This Agreement shall be valid for a period of five years and will become effective from the date when representatives of both universities shall have affixed their signatures to it. The Agreement may be further extended as a result of discussion by representative of both universities commencing not later than two months before the terminal date of the initial extension period.
